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UAE tops Arab world in competitiveness

THE UAE is ranked 17th globally in terms of competitiveness and it is followed by Saudi Arabia (30th), Kuwait (52) and Oman (62), according to the Arab World Competitiveness Report 2018. It was released by the World Bank Group in association with World Economic Forum.

Research by the World Economic Forum shows that by 2020 one in five jobs in the Arab world will require digital skills. Its report assessing the future of employment and skills requirements in the Middle East and North Africa region estimates 47 per cent of all work activity in the UAE faces increased automation.

The UAE, which leads the Arab region in terms of competitiveness, and is home to many tech firms, needs to increase efforts to expand the use of latest digital technologies to further enhance its dominance.

"Diversifying the economy, developing the private sector



and creating opportunities for the youth will require increasing the innovation content of the non-oil sector and navigating

through the Fourth Industrial Revolution," said the Competitiveness Report 2018.

The revolution is charac-

terised by the range of new technologies that are fusing the physical, digital and biological worlds.

have already put in place long-term strategies and heavy investments, "the entire region still has to fill the gap with the rest of the world when it comes to adopting and developing the most advanced technologies and the industries of the future".

The UAE has increased equity investments in technology firms from \$100 million to \$1.7 billion in just two years, according to the report's findings. In a bid to minimise its reliance on hydrocarbons, Abu Dhabi government-owned Mubadala Ventures, the venture capital arm of Mubadala Investment Company, will invest \$1 billion in local and global technology startups by 2021. Mubadala also aims to

create a \$400 mn fund to invest in leading European technology companies.

The survey says that Arab economies urgently need to diversify and foster entrepreneurial freedom to increase opportunities for young people and prepare the region for the technological transformations ahead. "Further progress will require Arab societies to rethink their existing social and economic models in order to increase competitiveness," it said.

Concerns about cyber dependency have increased dramatically in the resource-rich economies, meaning this trend has the third-highest potential impact on the region, the report said.

"In the UAE, half of companies are worried about cyber attacks (up from about 30 per cent in 2016)," the report said. One in five (up from one in 10 in 2016) regards data fraud as one of the major risks.

Because of fluctuating oil prices over the past few years, countries in the region have been forced to take measures to stabilise fiscal budgets and facilitate private sector development beyond oil. Last year, 40 per cent of businesses in the UAE were concerned about energy price shocks; while it was 42 and 46 per cent in Kuwait and Saudi Arabia, respectively. The report did not provide comparative figures for 2016.

MENA region experiences increase in people living on less than \$1.90 a day

MIDDLE East and North Africa (MENA) region saw an increase in the number of people living on less than \$1.90 a day, but levels of extreme poverty remained low. However, the region had more people living on less than \$5.50 per day in 2015 than in 1990. Additionally, almost one in seven people lacks adequate sanitation, stated the World Bank in its biennial Poverty and Shared Prosperity Report, titled 'Piecing Together the Poverty Puzzle'.

The South Asia region saw impressive growth of the incomes of its bottom 40 per cent between 2010 and 2015. Despite a 35-



percentage point decline in extreme poverty between 1990 and 2015, the region registered only an eight per cent decrease in people living on less than \$3.20 a day, and over 80 per cent of the region still lived below

\$5.50 per day in 2015. Also, the number of people in the region living in households without access to electricity or adequate sanitation was far greater than those living in monetary poverty. A third of the countries in

A third of the countries in the Sub-Saharan Africa region experienced negative income growth for the bottom 40% of their populations

the Sub-Saharan Africa region experienced negative income growth for the bottom 40 per cent of their populations. The region with the largest number of extreme poor, Africa saw its population nearly double between 1990 and 2015, with one of the largest increases in population being for those living on less than \$3.20 and more than \$1.90. The poor suffered from multiple deprivations such as low consumption levels and lack of access to education and basic infrastructure services.

Qatar govt eases exit rules

ACCORDING to overseas employment consultancies in Qatar henceforth the expatriates need not obtain their employers' permission to leave the country. The law came into force on October 28.

"Law No 13 of 2018... regulating the entry, exit and residency of expatriates is being implemented starting on Sunday," they said quoting an interior ministry announcement.

Qatar announced in September it had approved the law to scrap the exit visa system - a lynchpin of the country's 'kafala', or sponsorship system which many liken to modern-day slavery.

They said that under the new, all but five per cent of a company's workforce - report-



edly those in the senior positions - can leave without prior permission from employers.

Those not allowed to leave Qatar for any reason can file a complaint to the Expatriate Exit Grievance Committee that will "take a decision within three working days", the consultancies said quoting a ministry press note.

Scraping the exit permit is the biggest announcement made so far since Qatar agreed last November to enter into a three-year agreement with the UN's International Labour Organisation

to oversee reform. The football world cup 2022 host has come under intense pressure to reform its labour laws which have been repeatedly denounced by human rights groups. Critics have long argued for the abolition of the exit visa system.

Research data published last year by rights group <Migrant-Rights.org> found around a quarter of all exit visa requests were denied by the government. There are some two million foreign workers in Qatar.

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
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Multi-Donor Fund

THE World Bank (WB) Group has launched the Partnership Fund for the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG Fund) in support of global efforts to meet the SDGs. The aim of the multi-donor Fund is to incentivise catalytic activities that strengthen SDG implementation, equipping countries with tools and best practices to achieve their sustainable development objectives ahead of 2030. "We saw a funding gap for high-impact strategic initiatives at the global, regional & national and local levels that could help to catalyse countries development trajectories for the SDGs," says WB Group Senior Vice-President Mahmoud Mohieldin. "The Fund will complement the Group's efforts at the country level and focus on cross-country capacity building, quality data, knowledge generation, and multi-stakeholder partnerships." Sweden is the first partner to help launch the Fund with an initial contribution of \$7 million. The idea of the Fund grew from initial collaborations between Sweden and the WB Group on SDG Financing and SDG Trajectories. Through these initiatives, a shared vision developed between Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida) and the Group that many more catalytic innovations could be developed through continued collaboration. The first 16 SDGs prioritise action on human, economic and environmental pillars as well as peace and security. SDG 17 is the primary focus of the Fund, with its strong commitment to the means of implementation. Goal 17 promises support through global partnerships and co-operation, finance, data, trade, capacity building and peer-to-peer collaboration. One of the first funding allocations will support a WB Group activity to develop new methods to enhance the welfare impact of private sector investments. The Knowledge Support to Welfare Analysis of Private Sector Interventions activity will help create and share analytical frameworks, tools and data to mainstream welfare and inclusive growth impacts in development operations in line with SDGs to End Poverty (SDG 1), Promote Sustained and Inclusive Growth (SDG 8) and Reduce Inequality (SDG 10). The Fund will also support the Refugee Investment and Matchmaking Platform, which aims at bringing local business, global corporations, foundations, philanthropic investors and the development community together to create opportunities for refugees and host populations. Supporting small and medium enterprises across refugee and host communities, the platform will enable a multi-stakeholder investment catalyst instrument, business-to-business matchmaking, end-skill building, and knowledge embodied in SDG 16. In response to the need for access to good quality data for the goals, the Fund will support the 2020 Vision for a data-driven exploration of SDG monitoring and implementation. The activity will develop a series of SDG data-driven case studies that help national, regional and global policymakers strengthen awareness of how individual SDGs are being measured, monitored and invested in.

DAYS after the Supreme Court struck down Section 377 of Indian Penal Code which criminalised homosexuality in India, a crucial legislation for ensuring equal rights to persons affected by HIV and AIDS in getting treatment, admission in educational institutions and jobs has come into force.

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has announced implementation of the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) act through a gazette notification. The act, which received presidential assent on April 20 last year, prohibits discrimination against such persons in accessing healthcare, getting jobs, renting accommodation, and in admission to public and private educational institutions.

The move comes after the Delhi High Court asked the Centre why it has not yet notified the law to prevent discrimination against HIV and AIDS patients despite the statute receiving presidential assent in April last year. Hearing public interest litigation that sought immediate notification of the legislation, a bench of Chief Justice Rajendra Menon and Justice C Hari Shankar had asked the ministry "you make a law and are not notifying it. Why?" The matter was listed for hearing on November 26.

"In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section 3 of section 1 of the HIV and AIDS (Prevention and Control) Act, 2017, the Central government hereby appoints the 10th day of September, 2018, as the date on which the provisions of the said act shall come into force," the notification read.

According to the provisions of the act, no HIV test, medical treatment or research will be conducted on a person without his informed consent and no person shall be compelled to disclose his HIV status for obtaining employment or services, except with his informed consent, and if required by a court order.

The legislation has provisions to safeguard the property rights of HIV positive people, he said, adding that every HIV-infected/af-

ected person below the age of 18 years has the right to reside in a shared household and enjoy the facilities of the household.

The act also prohibits any individual from publishing information or advocating feelings of hatred against HIV positive persons and those living with them. It seeks to prevent and control the spread of HIV and AIDS and

As per the act, Union and state governments shall take measures to prevent the spread of HIV or AIDS, provide anti-retroviral therapy (ART) and infection management for persons with HIV or AIDS, and facilitate their access to welfare schemes, especially for women and children, among others.

The government will also is-

According to the UNAIDS Gap Report, there were close to 2.1-million PLWH in India till 2015. While there had been 68,000 AIDS-related deaths in 2015, around 86,000 new people

The Union/state governments shall take measures to prevent the spread of HIV or AIDS, provide ART and infection management for PLWHA, facilitate their access to welfare schemes especially for women and children, and others. An ombudsman shall be appointed by each state government to inquire into complaints related to the violation of the act and the provision of healthcare services.

Various grounds on which discrimination against HIV positive persons is prohibited under the act are denial, termination, discontinuation or unfair treatment with regard to employment, educational establishments, healthcare services, residing or renting property, among others

A person between the age of 12-18 years who has sufficient maturity in understanding and managing the affairs of his HIV or AIDS-affected family shall be competent to act as a guardian of another sibling below 18 years of age.

Cases relating to HIV positive persons shall be disposed of by the court on a priority basis. In any legal proceeding, if an HIV infected or affected person is a party, the court may pass orders that the proceedings be conducted (a) by suppressing the identity of the person; (b) in camera; and (c) to restrain any person from publishing information that discloses the identity of the applicant.

Zero hunger could save 301-mn lives a year: Singh

WORLD Food Day is a day of action dedicated to tackling global hunger. The theme of World Food Day 2018 is 'Our actions are our future - A zero hunger world by 2030 is possible'.

While speaking on the World Food Day, the Union Minister for Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, Radha Mohan Singh said that the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) takes action to remove the suffering from hunger and ensure food security and a nutritious diet for all. The focus of the Central government is that food is a basic need and fundamental human right.

Zero hunger could save the lives of 301 million a year, and can help build a safer, more prosperous world for everyone. The government aims at transforming India's agricultural sector to contribute to the achievements of global environmental objectives, and has launched a new project in association with Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), said the minister.

"The farmers are central to our efforts in food processing. We have a stated target of doubling farm incomes by 2022. Recently, the Pradhan Mantri Kisan SAMPADA Yojana, a national-level programme, was launched to create world-class food pro-

cessing infrastructure. This is expected to leverage investment of \$5 billion, benefit 2-million farmers and generate more than half-a-million jobs over the next two years," added the minister.

"Through Mega Food Parks, we aim to link agro-processing clusters with key production centres. This will offer immense value proposition in crops such as potato, pineapple, oranges and apples. Farmers groups are being encouraged to set up units in these parks, thereby reducing wastage and transportation costs, and creating new jobs," said Mr Singh.

"We plan to link villages through broadband connectivity, within a clear timeframe. We are digitising land records, and providing various services to the people on mobile platforms. The e-NAM, national agriculture e-market, is connecting agricultural markets nationwide, thereby giving farmers the benefit of competitive pricing, and freedom of choice," he said.

The *Indian Farming*, a monthly magazine of the ICAR, is dedicating a special issue on the theme of World Food Day 2018. Qualitative information contributed by renowned scientists of FAO, Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research and ICAR systems will benefit agriculture knowledge seekers, added Mr Singh.



Employers need to file registration and licensing applications online

TAKING cognizance of the Central government's focus on making India 'Digital India' by ensuring that various government services are made available to the citizens electronically and to provide trust-based efficient public service delivery by bringing transparency and accountability in the system, Ministry of Labour and Employment has initiated the process for providing the facilities of registration and licensing mandatorily online on the Shram Suvidha portal <www.shram-suvidha.gov.in/home> under: The Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970 (37 of 1970); The Interstate Migrant Workmen (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act and Rules, 1979 (30 of 1979); and The Building and Other Construction Workers (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 (27 of 1996). Now, as per the newly-

amended The Building and Other Construction Workers (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Central (Amendment) Rules, 2018 vide notification number GSR 830(E) dated September 4, 2018, the employers have to file applications for

the said portal. The draft rules to amend The Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Central Rules, 1971 and The Interstate Migrant Workmen (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Central Rules, 1980 for filing of applications and granting of certificate of registration/license online on the portal have been notified in the Gazette of India vide notification number GSR 829(E) and GSR 830(E) dated September 4, 2018.

Further, the notification number(s) SO 4259(E) and SO 4260(E) published in the official Gazette of India on September 4, 2018 provides for making applications regarding registration and licensing online on the portal till the said draft rules are finalised.

Moreover, the recently-published notifications provide for payment of registration/licensing fee and security deposit as required under the above three acts through e-payment only.

75% women's participation in production of major crops

THE Central government has allocated more than 30 per cent funds for women under various major schemes, programmes and development-related activities in order to bring women in the agriculture mainstream, said Radha Mohan Singh, Union Minister for Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare.

On the occasion of Mahila Kisan Diwas, the minister said about 18 per cent of the agricultural households in India is led by women. In addition to agriculture, women have been making exceptional contribution in horticulture, fisheries, animal husbandry, beekeeping etc.

A research by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) conducted in nine states shows that the participation of women is 75 per cent in the production of major crops, 79 per cent in horticulture, 51 per cent in post-harvest work and 95 per cent in animal husbandry and fisheries.

A National Gender Resource Centre in Agriculture, set up in the Department of Agriculture Cooperation & Farmers' Welfare (DAC&FW), has developed a women sensitisation module to bring about change in the mindset and behaviour of male programme operators.

In 2017-18, DAC&FW's MANAGE, EEI, SAMETI and other institutions have trained 5,645 people through 222 programmes. Besides, more than 98.14-lakh women farmers have been trained so far under the Agricultural Technology Management Agency (ATMA) Scheme.

Special importance is being given to the role of women in achieving the goal of doubling farmers' income by 2022. Keeping this in mind, the inter-ministerial committee formed under the chairmanship of Dr Dalwai has written a separate chapter on the empowerment of women to double the income of farmers.

These efforts will certainly prove to be effective in enhancing the participation of women in agriculture. The Central Institute for Women in Agriculture, Bhubaneswar (Odisha), set up under the ICAR, has also been working in this direction. Co-operative education programmes of women are organised through state cooperative societies to ensure women's participation in various activities in the field of cooperatives.

Under the National Cooperative Union of India, 38.78-lakh women have been trained in the last two years. Similarly, 6.07 lakh and 7,000 women have benefited through Krishi Vigyan Kendras and skill training, respectively. A total of 53.34-lakh women have benefited during 2016-18. Government's revised ATMA scheme is providing support to the food security groups of the farmers to ensure food security at the domestic and community levels.

Under this, the women's food security groups are being given financial assistance at the rate of 2 groups per block and at the rate of ₹ 10,000 per group per year. Women farmers are contributing in taking India to the path of Second Green Revolution and in changing the landscape of development in the country, added Mr Singh.

WGC to release blueprint on spot exchanges to govt

THE World Gold Council (WGC) will soon submit a blueprint to the government on spot exchanges, said Somasundaram P R, Managing Director-India, WGC. "We have given a blueprint. As a steering committee, we have drafted it and it is in the final stages, we will be releasing it very shortly," said Mr Somasundaram while speaking at an Assocham International Gold Summit.

Highlighting that demand for gold is likely to remain subdued in the current calendar year, Mr Somasundaram said that "while the demand for gold in the first half was seven per cent down compared to last year, the WGC expects it to pick up in the second half."

"But it will still be another very subdued year for demand, we expect the demand to be 700-800 tonnes. There is no specific catalyst to drive the demand up, while international gold price has come down by 8-10 per cent, Indian price has

gone up by 13-14 per cent."

Mr Somasundaram also said that reforms like GST and demonetisation have actually led to gold buying becoming a lot more organised, more so as grey market is also becoming weak,

influenced more by increase in income, the WGC expects demand for gold will slowly reach 800-900 tonnes by 2020.

Mr Somasundaram said it is imperative to step up transparency measures to make gold trans-

Ayushman Bharat, other factors may help insurance ind grow to \$280 bn by '20

INDIAN insurance industry is expected to grow to \$280 billion by FY 2020 with the government's flagship Ayushman Bharat-National Health Protection Mission (AB-NHPM) and other growth drivers like rising disposable incomes, presence of global players and easing of the regulatory regime, helping penetration of the insurance culture in the country, says a study by the country's leading industrial apex body Assocham and research firm APAS.

Overall insurance penetration in the country reached 3.7 per cent in 2017 from 2.71 per cent in 2001. Gross premium increased from ₹ 3.2 trillion (\$49 billion) in FY12 to reach close to ₹ 5 trillion (\$72 billion) in FY18.

Push by the government and the regulator help increase the penetration of insurance sector. Several factors such as growing middle class, young population and increasing awareness towards the need for

protection and retirement planning would enable the growth further, observes the study.

AB-NHPM, the ambitious scheme of the government, covering 100-million poor and vulnerable families with a cover of ₹ 5 lakh per family of tertiary care and hospitalisation would be a game changer for insurance industry, as it would have a great multiplier impact on a host of allied sectors and create lakhs of new jobs.

Private sector companies which presently hold close to 48 per cent market share in the general insurance and 29 per cent in the life insurance would see a big growth in opportunities. Private sector hospitals would also be major partners in the roll out of the countrywide scheme, for which an initial sum of ₹ 12,000 crore has been provided.

An effective implementation of the scheme will help the entire healthcare and allied sectors like pharmaceutical, diagnostics, medical devices, data management, insurance hospitality third-party administrators,

quality accreditation and human resource management with the help of information and communication technologies across the value chain.

Taking stock of the present state, the study says that the domestic life insurance industry registered 11 per cent year-on-year growth for new business premium in 2017-18 generating revenue of \$30 billion. The premiums for non-life insurance industry increased by 17.5 per cent year-on-year in FY18.

The government has taken a number of initiatives to boost the insurance industry. The foreign direct investment (FDI) limit has been increased from 26 per cent to 49 per cent, while the regulator, Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority, has allowed insurers investments up to 10 per cent in additional tier-I bonds that are issued by banks to increase their tier-I capital.

The medium-term outlook for the life insurance industry remains robust, with solid premium growth forecast over the next five years to 2023.

AS Argentina is the President of G-20 this year, Minister for Foreign Affairs of Argentina, Jorge Faurie and Minister for Production and Labour, Dante Sica jointly chaired the sessions. The overall objective of Argentine Presidency of G-20 is "Building consensus for fair and sustainable development".

Global trade and economic situation is at a critical stage due to the ongoing trade tensions, driven largely by protectionist and unilateral measures by some countries, said the Union Minister for Commerce and Industry, Suresh Prabhu.

He was speaking at the G-20 Trade Ministers Meeting (TMM) held at Mar del Plata in Argentina. The G-20 TMM was represented by ministers/vice-ministers of G-20 countries, eight guest countries and seven heads/deputy heads of international organisations such as WTO, ITC, OECD, World Bank, IMF, CAF and IADB.

The minister highlighted the need to collectively work towards enhancing confidence in international trade through dialogue and collaborations. Mr Prabhu underlined that as developing countries and LDCs suffer consequential collateral damage due to trade conflicts, resolution of differences through dialogue between the parties should be promoted.

He urged G-20 to change the narrative on trade by focusing on the potential of services for enhancing global trade,



keeping in view that services contribute more than 50 per cent to the world GDP.

Endorsing India's commitment to the rule-based multilateral trading system, Mr Prabhu called for collective action for revitalising WTO without undermining its core principles of special and differential treatment, consensus building, inclusiveness and transparency.

Speaking on the occasion, most members recalled the successful WTO Mini Ministerial meeting held in New Delhi in March 2018 as India's significant contribution to the revitalisation of WTO.

The ministers recognised the importance of Agro Food Global Value Chains for enhancing

global food security. Mr Prabhu pinpointed the relevance of keeping in focus realisation of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 2030 targets relating to removal of hunger, alleviation of poverty, empowerment of women and employment generation without losing sight of the plight of millions of small and marginal farmers in developing countries and LDCs.

He further drew attention to the need for tackling non-tariff barriers in the form of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (SPS) that are more trade distorting than tariffs.

He urged G-20 to support transfer of technology, research, promote agriculture services and responsible investment in

agriculture businesses with an aim to encouraging greater value addition for MSMEs.

On the new industrial revolution, the ministers acknowledged the central role of digital technologies. Mr Prabhu drew attention to the need for minimising technology disruptions and promoting distributive gains for the collective good of all countries and, in this regard, he urged G-20 to work towards closing gaps in the digital divide within and across nations through capacity-building measures, technology adaptation and meaningful investments to give primacy to protection and promotion of domestic entrepreneurs in order to create jobs for millions of youth.

brings about successful resolution of stressed asset cases in a time-bound manner, says an Assocham-CRISIL joint study. Reduction in the timeline for resolution of stressed assets under the IBC would not only enhance confidence of investors but would also make them go in for even less than AAA bonds, the study notes. Presently, about 90 per cent of trading is restricted to AAA and AA-rated categories.

"With greater certainty of outcome and expectations of a faster resolution because of the IBC, the interest of both domestic and foreign investors in lower-rated paper will increase over time," says the study.

Countries such as Brazil, Russia, China and the UK had taken steps to reform the bank-

kets for funding requirements. "This, along with the Code, will provide a boost to the Indian bond market," points out the study.

On the role of the Asset Reconstruction Companies (ARCs), the study says that a structural shift is expected in the Indian stressed-asset market that would lead to a reset of business models in the ARC industry. ARCs may partner with large funds for increasing their capital base and, hence, may go for large acquisitions. At present, despite deceleration in growth, ARCs' Asset Under Management is expected to reach ₹ 1-lakh crore by June 2019.

Over time, the Code will help promote entrepreneurship and increase the role of professionals from various fields such as law, accountancy and finance. While a number of steps have been taken for the implementation of the IBC, challenges persist at multiple levels, including infrastructure issues, inter-creditor conflicts and limited development of the secondary market.

Improved connectivity will help boost bilateral trade with Bangladesh

BANGLADESH is sending a strong buyer delegation to India during the upcoming Indusfood-II to be held in January 2019, in Greater Noida, organised jointly with Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce and Industry. This was announced by Jahangir Bin Alam, Secretary & CEO of Dhaka-based India-Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry, who visited Trade Promotion Council of India office in Delhi for talks.

The bilateral trade between the two countries touches \$9 billion, out of which Bangladesh exports goods worth \$900 million.

Mr Alam said trade growth depends on the developmental progress of Bangladesh. Bangladesh is growing and hence trade is increasing with India and the rest of the world. India being an immediate neigh-

bour with whom Bangladesh not only shares a long border but also culture, traditions and language will be looking towards India to import the items it needs, he said.

There is immense scope for increasing food & beverages (F&B) exports from India to Bangladesh. Presently, Bangladesh's total import of F&B from the world is \$5,016.4 million, out of which India is fifth in ranking with exports worth \$332.4 million. Bangladesh currently sources 17.2 per cent of its F&B requirements from Brazil, followed by Indonesia (12.1 per cent), Canada (9.7 per cent) Argentina (9.1 per cent) and India (6.6 per cent).

Fresh fruits going from India to Bangladesh are: mangoes, grapes, pomegranates and apples. Among other F&B products, there is still great scope for added export of dried, shelled chickpeas, fresh or chilled onions and shallots, food prepa-

rations, cumin seeds, fresh grapes, semi-milled or wholly-milled rice, black fermented tea and partly-fermented tea, turmeric and cane sugar.

Improved connectivity between the two countries will help a lot in developing trade further. Till recently, maximum trade between India and Bangladesh was routed through ports in Singapore. The traditional river waterways that connected various cities in Bangladesh to India were operational up till 1965.

The recent thrust to rebuild those waterways and develop new routes to ease connectivity will not only be in the interest of bilateral trade between India and Bangladesh, but will also help Indian mainland to connect better with its own North-eastern states.

Indusfood is being billed as the World Food Supermarket – a one-stop event to source all requirements related to food and beverage from India.

Nitin Gadkari reiterates govt's commitment towards Nirmal Ganga

THE Central government notified the minimum environmental flows for River Ganga that has to be maintained at various locations on the river. Environmental flows are the acceptable flow regimes that are required to maintain a river in the desired environmental state or predetermined state.

Calling this a significant development, Union Minister for Water Resources, River Development and Ganga Rejuvenation, Nitin Gadkari said the notification of e-flow for the river would go a long way in ensuring its *aviralta* or continuous flow. Reiterating the government's commitment towards an *aviral* and Nirmal Ganga, the minister informed that the draft Ganga Act will soon be sent to the Cabinet for approval.

"This is a very significant moment. The discussions on notifying e flow of Ganga have been going on for a long time. We have taken this step to ensure a minimum amount of flow in the river," said Mr Gadkari.

The notification issued by the government will ensure that the river has at least the minimum required environmental flow of water even after the river flow gets diverted by projects and structures for purposes like irrigation, hydropower, domestic and industrial use etc. This is an important step taken towards maintaining the uninterrupted or *aviral* flow of the river.

The order will apply to the upper Ganga River Basin starting from originating glaciers and through respective confluences of its head tributaries finally meeting at Devprayag up to Haridwar and the main stem of River Ganga up to Unnao district of Uttar Pradesh.



On the issue of construction of hydropower projects in Uttarakhand, Mr Gadkari said views of various stakeholders are being taken and a considered decision will then be taken in this regard.

Meanwhile, the Union Minister for Drinking Water and Sanitation, Uma Bharti called the notification of e-flow for Ganga a 'historic' step and thanked Mr Gadkari for taking forward the work she had started.



"Ganga has been a symbol of faith for me personally. But after starting working on Ganga, I developed the proper understanding of the problems. It is in this regard that this notification is a historic step and a begin-

ning to rejuvenate all the rivers of India," said Ms Bharti.

She added that hydropower projects should be implemented in such a way that they do not disturb the continuous flow of rivers.

Maharashtra coast to be developed as tourism hotspot: Commerce Min

MAHARASHTRA coast will be developed as a tourist hotspot, said Suresh Prabhu, Union Minister for Commerce & Industry and Civil Aviation.

While writing a letter to develop the coast to Union Minister of State for Tourism, K J Alphons and Chief Minister of Maharashtra, Devendra Fadnis, the minister said that the marine leisure sector is the fastest-growing segment of the travel industry and growth of cruise ship industry, seaside destination resorts, marine parks, scuba diving and aquariums.

India, with a coastline of 7,500 kms, has tremendous potential for development in this sector. The Ministry of Commerce & Industry and

Aviation has received a proposal from the Services Export Promotion Council and Indian Institute of Scuba Diving and Aquatic Sports (IISDA) Malwan, Sindhudurg, for a comprehensive plan to encourage marine tourism along the coast of Maharashtra.

The proposal includes development of scuba diving and domestic cruise tourism destinations at Angria Bank, underwater tourism of global standards, submarine tourism in Sindhudurg, setting up India's largest aquarium in Sindhudurg to create awareness about marine biodiversity and strengthening IISDA as an accredited institute for innovation and skill development in the aquatic tourism sector.

This proposal will complement

Tourism Ministry's initiative for development of coastal circuit in Sindhudurg to be executed through Maharashtra Tourism Development Corporation, for which an amount of ₹ 82.17 crore has already been sanctioned.

Mr Prabhu asked both the ministers to consider the proposal for early action under the Champion Sector Initiative. In February 2018, the Union Cabinet had decided to give focussed attention to 12 champion services sectors and mandated the identified nodal ministries and departments to formulate sectoral action plans under the dedicated fund of ₹ 5,000 crore.

The Ministry of Tourism has been identified as the nodal ministry for the Tourism and Hospitality champion services sectors.

THE new Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) affiliation bye-laws was released recently. The affiliation bye-laws have been completely revamped to ensure speed, transparency, hassle-free procedures and ease of doing business with the CBSE, said Prakash Javadekar, Union Minister for Human Resources Development.

While interacting with media at press conference, the minister informed that earlier this year, the Board was asked to completely revisit its affiliation bye-laws to make the system more robust and quality driven. The new bye-laws denote a major shift from the highly-complex procedures followed earlier, to a simplified system based on preventing duplication of processes.

CBSE is a national-level Board conducting examinations for classes X and XII. It affiliates schools across India and abroad upon fulfilment of various conditions as prescribed in its affiliation bye-laws. At present 20,783 schools are affiliated with the Board. The affiliation bye-laws in position were first made in 1988 and were last modified in 2012.

One of the salient features of the revised bye-laws rests on the fact that there is duplication of processes at CBSE and state government level. For issuing recognition under Right to Education (RTE) Act and NOC, the state education administration verifies various certificates to be obtained from local bodies, revenue department, co-operatives department etc.

The CBSE re-verifies them after applications are received. This is a very long-drawn process. Therefore, to prevent this duplication, schools will now be required to submit only 2 documents at the time of applying for affiliation, instead of 12-14 documents being submitted earlier: one would be a document vetted by the head of district education administration validating all aspects such as building safety, sanitation, land ownership

etc, and another would be a self-affidavit where the school would certify its adherence to fee norms, infrastructure norms etc.

As a result of this major change, the Board shall not revisit any of the aspects vetted by the state during inspection and the delay due to scrutiny and non-compliance of deficient

In the new bye-laws, the school inspection will be done as soon as applications are received. On satisfactory inspection report, the Board will issue a

ucator, wellness counsellor, salaries through digital payment etc.

On complying with all these conditions, the school will submit an online commencement certificate latest by March 31 of the given year, based on which, the Board shall confirm affiliation of the school. Only then the schools shall be able to start new academic session under CBSE.

The new affiliation bye-laws also lay thrust on achieving academic excellence through mandatory teacher training. Even the principals and vice-principals of every school are expected to undergo two-days mandatory training on an annual basis.

A special category of innovative schools has been added to include specialised schools, not covered elsewhere in these bye-laws, who are implementing innovative ideas in the fields of skill development, sports, arts, sciences etc. Regarding fee, the provisions include full fee disclosure to be made and no hidden charges to be levied by schools in the garb of fees.

The bye-laws clearly state that fee is to be charged as per the regulation of the appropriate government and fee revision shall be subject to laws, regulations and directions of the appropriate government.

Also, for the first time, the bye-laws encourage schools to promote environmental conservation through harnessing solar energy, rainwater harvesting, greening of campus, recycling and segregation of waste, Swachhata on campus etc.

It may be mentioned here that CBSE has 20,783 schools affiliated to it in India and 25 other countries, with over 1.9-crore

students in these schools, and more than 10-lakh teachers. The revised bye-laws will positively impact the existing and future

schools by easing procedures and redirecting their focus towards improving the quality of education.

East Asia and Pacific region best performers

EAST Asia and Pacific region was one of the best performers. The incomes of the poorest 40 per cent of the population grew on average 4.7 per cent between 2010 and 2015. East Asia not only had the largest reductions in extreme poverty, but also in the proportion of people living on less than \$3.20 and \$5.50 per day. While extreme poverty is very low, the region saw a higher percentage of people lacking access to sanitation.

Many countries in Europe and Central Asia region suffered setbacks in the growth of incomes of its bottom 40 per cent. On the other hand, several economies whose bottom 40 per cent suffered large declines because of the financial and the debt crisis were recovering. Among developing regions, Europe and Central Asia had the lowest percentage of people living under the \$3.20 and \$5.50 poverty lines. However, in the share of people lacking schooling enrollment, it performs less well than either East Asia and Pacific or Latin

America and the Caribbean. Latin America and the Caribbean region saw less shared prosperity from 2010 to 2015 than in previous years as its economies were impacted by a slowdown in global commodity prices. The region had almost 11 per cent living on less than \$3.20 a day and over 26 per cent on less than \$5.50 a day in 2015. Poverty in non-monetary dimensions such as lack of access to drinking water, adequate sanitation or electricity was much less associated with monetary aspects.


