Afghan Needs

ACTION is needed to safeguard recent economic recovery in Afghanistan in the context of upcoming elections and worsening drought conditions, says the latest edition of Afghanistan Development Update by the World Bank Group. Business reforms and smooth election process are needed to sustain growth. The twice-a-year update states that following the economic shock of the withdrawal of international troops, the associated decline in aid and deterioration in security, and the period of political instability after the 2014 elections, the Afghan economy has slowly regained momentum as reforms have been implemented and confidence restored. From a low of 1.5 per cent in 2015, real gross domestic product (GDP) growth accelerated to 2.3 per cent in 2016, and reached 2.7 per cent in 2017. However, this trend now appears to be at risk, with increasing election-related violence, declining business confidence, worsening drought conditions, and apparent slowing of economic activity. Growth is projected at 2.4 per cent in 2018, with substantial downside risks arising from the prospects of political instability around upcoming parliamentary and district council elections and presidential and provincial council elections, scheduled for October 2018 and April 2019 respectively. "At the current juncture, the most important priority for the government and its international partners is to maintain public confidence to support growth and job creation," says Shubham Chaudhuri, World Bank Country Director for Afghanistan. "More than half of Afghans now live in poverty. We cannot afford to see the current momentum lost." According to the World Bank, government macroeconomic policies remain appropriate in the current conditions. The fiscal deficit for 2017 was low at around 0.5 per cent of GDP, and a similar deficit is expected in 2018. The deficit will be financed largely from cash reserves, which remain at comfortable levels. Revenues remain strong, with domestic revenues reaching a new high of 12.3 per cent of GDP in 2017. Consumer price inflation remained moderate in 2017, at around 3.1 per cent, and is expected to remain at moderate levels through 2018. Sustaining the recent recovery will require enhanced government efforts to improve the business environment and catalyse private investment and job creation while ensuring smooth election processes. The international community also has a key role to play: "Sustaining international support is critical to overall confidence and underpins the capacity of the government to implement the reforms we all view as vital," says Mr Chaudhuri. Assuming a relatively smooth election process, no further deterioration of the security environment, and the absence of political instability that followed 2014 elections, the World Bank is projecting a gradually accelerating growth over coming years. Growth is expected to reach 2.8 per cent in 2019 before accelerating gradually to 3.6 per cent in 2021. Much faster rates of growth would be required to make a substantial impact on poverty. Significantly, faster growth could be achieved by mobilising investment in extractives, energy and connectivity.

IN a major boost to India-Africa relations, the Narendra Modi government has approved the opening of new Indian missions in 18 African countries, a step that is expected to go a long way in enhancing India's diplomatic outreach in the continent.

With so much potential on the continent, India has no desire to be left out of the African picture. The decision to start these new Indian missions in Africa – which will take the number of Resident Indian Missions in Africa from 29 to 47 – is seen as a bid to strengthen ties between Asia's third-largest economy and the resource-rich continent where India's strategic rival China has built a formidable presence in recent years.

The 18 missions will be opened over a four-year period between 2018 and 2021. The new missions will come up in Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Cape Verde, Chad, Republic of the Congo, Djibouti, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Guinea, Guinea Bissau, Liberia, Mauritania, Rwanda, Sao Tome and Principe, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Swaziland and Togo.

Interestingly, China last year opened a naval base in Djibouti. It was also the first stop of Indian President Ram Nath Kovind during a two-nation tour of Djibouti and Ethiopia in October 2017.

India has been focussing on the African continent with a vigour rarely seen until now. President Kovind – who has made no secret of the fact that he considers Africa to hold a special place in his heart – has visited the continent three times since he was sworn in.

Indeed, all his three overseas trips have been to Africa. In October 2017, Kovind travelled to Djibouti and Ethiopia. In March 2018, he visited Mauritius and Madagascar, and in April, he toured Equatorial Guinea (incidentally India's fourth largest oil and gas supplier), Swaziland, and Zambia. The decision will enhance India's diplomatic outreach in the African continent and allow India to engage with Indian diaspora in African countries.

The opening of new missions

is also a step towards implementing the vision of enhanced co-operation and engagement with Africa.

Once seen as a key influence in Africa in the 60s-80s supporting independence and decolonisation movements on the continent, India has seen its promi-

54 African countries including 41 at the level of heads of governments or states.

In yet another first, India will be constructing convention centres across 21 African countries, beginning with Niger in Western Africa. The goal here is to enable Niger to host the African Union

build the Presidential Palace and the Parliament in Ghana. Currently, India is helping to construct the Parliament building in Swaziland, in the aftermath of Kovind's April visit.

Indian investment in Africa is also being ramped up, with over 140 Indian enterprises (from

5,97,464 villages – one step closer to universal household electrification. That India is diversifying the ways in which it can enhance economic co-operation – and promote its diplomatic profile – in Africa is significant.

Recent figures are impressive: India has extended 152 lines of credit to the tune of almost \$8 billion to 44 African countries, for developing agri-

culture, infrastructure, clean energy, and manufacturing.

The African Continental Free Trade Agreement (AfCFTA) has been welcomed as promising for Indian enterprises and industries, while the idea of a separate free-trade agreement has also been tossed around.

Indian leaders are currently giving Africa a lot of space in their international travel agendas. Vice-President Venkaiah Naidu is scheduled to visit Botswana, Malawi, and Equatorial Guinea in October. Mr Modi is set to visit Egypt sometime later this year. This kind of attention is long overdue.

The participants need to conduct information-education-communication activities for increasing awareness of village people about sanitation and hygiene; and solid waste management related activities in the village, said Mr Singh.

internship programme will be given a Swachh Bharat Summer Internship Certificate on completion of their internship and its approval by their parent institution. Apart from these certificates, the best



interns will be recognised with shields/cups at college level and cash prizes of ₹ 30,000, ₹ 20,000 and ₹ 10,000 at university level; ₹ 50,000, ₹ 30,000 and ₹ 20,000 at state level and ₹ 2

lakh, ₹ 1 lakh and ₹ 50,000 at the national level.

As per the guidelines of the internship programme, two curriculum credits are to be given by institutions affiliated with University

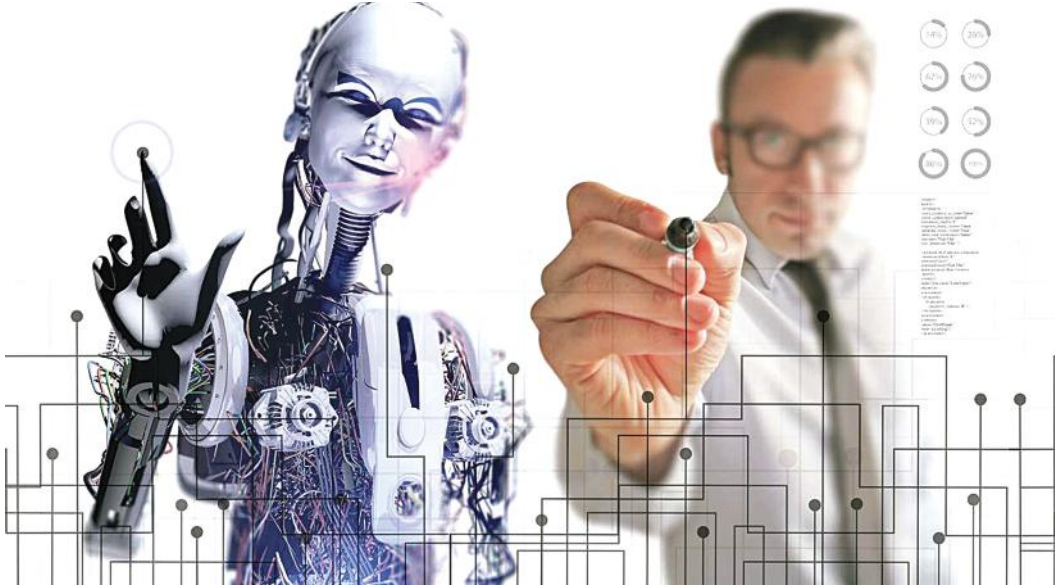

Railways introduces innovative approach to locomotive scheduling

INDIAN Railways has introduced an innovative analytical approach to optimise the deployment of electric and diesel locomotives run passenger trains. This involves use of a software based mathematical decision support system to increase the productivity of locomotives.

Indian Railways has a fleet of about 3,300 electric and diesel locomotive running passenger trains across the country. Locomotives are deployed to run passenger trains through cyclic schedules called locomotive links. Hitherto, locomotive links were being manually prepared by the respective 16 zones to operate the trains allocated to the zones.

Ministry of Railways, with the help of experts, has evolved and



implemented the software based decision support system to optimise the deployment of locomotives to run passenger trains at an all-India level. A pilot optimisation exercise has been conducted by Transformation Cell of Railway Board, with active participation of all the 16 zonal railways. This has resulted in reorganising of loco-

motive links, which will save 30 diesel and 42 electric locomotives (costing about ₹ 720 crore) being currently run in passenger services. The revised links are under implementation. These 72 locomotives released from passenger operations will be utilised to run additional freight trains and earn additional revenues.

BAD breath is one of the embarrassing things for anyone. This becomes worse when you have to sit next to someone who suffers from this. Medically called halitosis, bad breath can result from poor dental health habits and maybe a sign of other health problems. Bad breath can also be made worse by the types of foods you eat and other unhealthy lifestyle habits.

How is that so? All the food eaten begins to be broken down in your mouth. If you eat foods with strong odours (such as garlic or onions), brushing and flossing – even mouthwash – merely covers up the odour temporarily. The odour will not go away completely until the food has passed through your body.

In addition, odour-causing bacteria and food particles can also cause bad breath if dentures are not properly cleaned. Smoking or chewing tobacco-based products also can cause bad breath, stain teeth, reduce your ability to taste foods, and irritate your gums.

According to Spielman, 90 per cent of bad breath is caused by bacteria, which break down food and salivary proteins in the mouth and, in the process, "release odorous compounds." Bacteria hide out on the tongue. Morning is the worst time because our mouths have been dry all night, giving bacteria plenty of time to work their smelly magic.

Bad breath isn't always what it seems. Once foods such as garlic and onion are metabolised by the liver, their odour is excreted in perspiration and from the lungs, rather than from the mouth. A bad odour coming from an exhale through the nose is a sign of something systemic, which affects the body as a whole and can indicate an underlying medical condition such as liver disease or diabetes.

There are no statistics on what percentage of the population has bad breath. That's because studies usually rely on someone reporting whether or not they think they have bad breath and may not be accurate.

But studies show that about 80 per cent of bad breath comes from an oral source. For instance, cavities or gum disease can lead to bad breath, as can tonsils that have trapped food particles; cracked fillings, and less-than-clean dentures.

We said bad breath could also be pointers to other health issues. What are they? It's true, persistent bad breath or a bad taste in the mouth maybe a

medical condition dry mouth (also called xerostomia) also can cause bad breath. Saliva is necessary to moisten the mouth, neutralise acids produced by plaque, and wash away dead cells that accumulate on the tongue, gums, and cheeks. If not removed, these cells decompose and can cause bad breath. Dry mouth maybe a side effect of various medications, salivary gland problems,

Practise good oral hygiene

Brush twice a day with fluoride toothpaste to remove food debris and plaque. Brush teeth after you eat. Don't forget to brush the tongue, too. Replace your toothbrush every two to three months or after an illness. Use floss or an interdental cleaner to remove food particles and plaque between teeth once a day. Rinse with an antibacterial

warning sign of gum (periodontal) disease. Gum disease is caused by the buildup of plaque on teeth. Bacteria cause the formation of toxins to form, which irritate the gums. If gum disease continues untreated, it can damage the gums and jawbone.

Other dental causes of bad breath include poorly fitting dental appliances, yeast infections of the mouth, and dental caries (cavities).

Many other diseases and illnesses may cause bad breath. Here are some to be aware of: respiratory tract infections such as pneumonia or bronchitis, chronic sinus infections, post-nasal drip, diabetes, chronic acid reflux, and liver or kidney problems.

Bad breath can be reduced or prevented if you are able to follow the below instructions:

Drink lots of water

This will keep your mouth moist. Stay hydrated. If you can't brush your teeth after every meal, drinking a lot of water can help speed up the process of cleaning harmful bacteria and debris



You need not put up with bad breath. It can be treated with some help. Here are a few

from between your teeth. Drinking milk can even help deodorise some offensive breath odours. Avoid sugary drinks. Chewing gum (preferably sugarless) or sucking on candy (preferably sugarless) also stimulates the production of saliva, which helps wash away food particles and bacteria. Gums and mints containing xylitol are best.

Keep a log of the foods you eat

If you think they maybe causing bad breath, bring the log to your dentist to review. Similarly, make a list of the medications you take. Some drugs may play a role in creating mouth odours.



Good oral hygiene also is key to fighting bad breath. Ideally, you should brush and floss after every meal to help reduce the odour-causing bacteria in your mouth.

Consider snacking on raw carrots, celery, or apple slices. It's good to have a nice watery vegetable in there that will help clear your mouth of debris. Avoid breath busters such as garlic, onions, and some other spicy foods. Chronic garlic users cannot only have chronic bad breath, they also often have body odour.

Don't drink too much coffee

It maybe tasty, but coffee is a tough smell to get off the back of your tongue. Consider switching to an herbal or green tea.

Don't smoke or use other tobacco products. Cigarettes, pipes, and snuff can foul your breath. Smoking can give people horrible breath. And some people carry this stuff worse than others.

Cut back on alcohol

Be careful with breath mints. Sugar-free mints are OK for a quick fix but only mask the offensive smell and don't do anything to remove harmful bad bacteria. Tempted to pick up a sugary mint as you leave your favourite restaurant? Don't. The sugar will only sit on your teeth and make the problem worse.

If you can keep these things in mind, you can avoid the embarrassment of bad mouth smell.
