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Business confidence rising in UAE

The global economic recovery that started in late 2016 is starting to slow down and lose momentum, with global confidence in second quarter dipping from its first quarter high. Despite this, across the Middle East and in the UAE, confidence rebounded further in the second quarter of the year and is now at its highest level since second quarter 2015

CONOMIC confidence in ■ the UAE and other Middle East countries rebounded to its highest level since the second quarter of 2015 in sharp contrast to a decline in global confidence level in the same quarter this year, according to a

The key factor behind the recovery in confidence in the UAE and the larger region from the second quarter of 2018 is the sharp rise in the oil price, which peaked at \$80 per barrel in late May, compared with a low of \$35 per barrel at the start of 2016.

"This has resulted in an increase in revenues coupled with the introduction of Value Added Tax (VAT) in the UAE and Saudi Arabia, which has led to an ease in fiscal austerity," said the Global Economic Conditions survey released by the Association of Chartered from its first quarter high. "The recent Opec deal, which was agreed in late June and saw member countries agree to raise production, is likely to depress prices over the coming months. However, with VAT being introduced across the Gulf Cooperation Council

(GCC) (with the UAE and Saudi

Arabia live), it will relieve the pressure that was once felt prior to this fiscal policy being introduced, which will continue to provide economic relief and reduce further oil price dependency on economic growth," said Ms de Nuncques.

"It's good to see the im-

provement in confidence across the Middle East region, and while oil prices are a key factor behind this, expenditure for the 2020 World Expo in Dubai has also helped, along with an easing of austerity, but this diverse region is not immune from global economic shocks and therefore it is advisable that businesses should not be complacent," she said.

Hanadi Khalife, Director of Middle East and Africa (MEA) and India operations at the IMA, said the results of the survey show increasing business confidence in the Middle East which has been stimulated by continued investments made across a number of key industries.

"This falls in line with the objectives set by governments to achieve long-term regional plans such as UAE Vision 2021 and Saudi Vision 2030. The report shows that government spending is at a multi-year high and this is particularly focussed on diversifying regional economies and driving sustainable economic development."



Digital Jobs

IGITAL jobs can bring new employment opportunities for young women in developing countries, says a new report by the Solutions for Youth Employment (S4YE) coalition. The report, incorporates insights drawn from 19 case studies and lavs out how jobs in the digital economy can increase young women's productivity, earnings, and financial independence. Globally, the share of women using the internet is 12 per cent lower than that of men. Over 1.2 billion women in low and middleincome countries do not use mobile internet, and women in these countries are 10 per cent less likely to own mobile phones than men. Digital jobs can help reduce longstanding occupational segregation, including in the IT sector. Working in the digital economy offers young women the flexibility to overcome mobility constraints and combat restrictive gender norms. Currently, women account for only 38 per cent of human capital wealth world-wide, compared to 62 per cent for men. It is also estimated that \$160 trillion in wealth is lost due to gender inequality in earnings. With unemployment rates for youth reported over 300 per cent higher than those for adults, young women are at a higher risk of exclusion, according to the report. While digital technology continues to create new forms of work, the absence of appropriate policies will prevent it from being fully inclusive. The report examines public and private sector initiatives that aim to close the gender gap in the digital economy. To empower women, governments can ensure women's online rights are protected, promoting gender-inclusive digital skills in the education system, provide and subsidise equitable access to information and communications technology systems and run public initiatives to close the gender divide in the digital world. The private sector can implement more inclusive policies to address gender bias in the workspace as well as promote gender equity in supply chains. "Digital jobs offer a unique opportunity for young men and women to overcome social, economic and political constraints to their participation in the workforce," says Mamadou Biteye, Chair of S4YE's Board of Directors and Managing Director for Africa at The Rockefeller Foundation. The report also provides operational recommendations in designing and implementing gender-inclusive interventions for young women seeking to enter the digital economy. It presents a newly developed typology which identifies the public sector, private sector, online outsourcing, and digital platforms that improve livelihoods, as the four drivers of demand for digital jobs. This typology can be used to map the degree to which digital jobs are accessible to different subgroups of youth and aims to help policy makers in making investment decisions on local initiatives that support virtual freelancing or digital start-ups, creating more employment and entrepreneurship opportunities for young women.

HE current position of organic farming with respect to area covered across the country is 23.02 lakh hectares (ha) under the schemes Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yo-Value Chain Development for North Eastern Region (MOVCD-NER) and National Programme of Organic Production (NPOP).

Under PKVY and MOVCD-NER schemes enough assistance is provided to Farmer Producer Companies (FPCs)/entrepreneurs for development of value chains/marketing of organic produce, said the Union Minister of State for Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Parshottam

Cost of organic agriculture largely depends on on-farm generation of inputs. When on-farm organic inputs are used, cost of production per unit area is less by 13 per cent under organic agriculture than inorganic management.

However, if organic inputs from outside the farm are purchased and utilised, the cost of production increases by about 15-20 per cent depending on the nature of inputs used. Integrated Organic Farming System (IOFS) models being developed under National Project on Organic Farming (NPOF) promises to meet 70-80 per cent of organic inputs within the farm thus reducing the market input cost considerably.

During the conversion period of initial two to three years, yield levels are expected to be low till soil system regains to respond to organic production system especially in the intensive agriculture areas, said Mr Rupala.

Government of India under the schemes – PKVY & MOVCD-NER is supporting the production and marketing of organic produce in the country to reduce their costs and prices. Use of organic inputs like Phosphate Rich Organic Manure (PROM), vermicompost, organic/bio-fertilizers, city compost, waste decomposer have been promoted under these schemes which will further reduce the costs of production in organic farming.

Under the following schemes, policy measures are taken by the government to develop/boost marketing of certified organic produce easily available to household consumers to promote organic farming:

PKVY – Financial assistance jana (PKVY), Mission Organic is given for direct marketing to the groups and clusters including procuring common packing ma-

tions (FPOs)/FPCs for creation, collection and aggregation of post-harvest process centre (one between every 5-10 groups) at ₹ 20 lakh/cluster of 1,000 ha

FPC and 50 per cent to private). PKVY is the first comprehensive scheme launched as a Centrally Sponsored Programme (CSP) since 2015-16, which now has been revised for next three vears. The scheme is implemented with a 90:10 (Government of India:state government) funding pattern in eight NE states and three hilly states of Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand, 100 per cent in Union territory and 60:40 funding pattern in remaining states of the country.

The new guidelines of the scheme has been uploaded in the website <www.agricoop. nic.in/guidelines/integrated-nutrient-management>. PKVY is implemented by the state government on per hectare basis for 500-1,000 hectare area in each cluster. A group of farmers having a total area of 20 hectare as far as possible in contagious patch within a village.

The farmer within a group can avail benefit to a maximum of two ha., and the limit of as-

clusters. Under PKVY scheme, 2,37,820 hectares of land has been converted into organic farming land and 3,94,550 farmers have been benefitted.

Realising the potential of organic farming in the North Eastern region of the country, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare has launched a Central Sector Scheme entitled 'Mission Organic Value Chain Development for North Eastern Region' for implementation in the states of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura, during 2015-16 to 2017-18.

The scheme aims at development of certified organic production in a value chain mode to link growers with consumers and to support the development of entire value chain starting from inputs, seeds, certification and creation of facilities for collection, aggregation, processing, marketing and brand building initiative. The scheme was approved with an outlay of ₹ 400

GST revenue collection for August 2018 close to 94K

and Services Tax (GST) revenue collected in the month of August, 2018 is ₹ 93,960 crore, of which Central Goods and Services Tax (CGST) is ₹ 15,303 crore, State Goods and Services Tax (SGST) is ₹ 21,154 crore, Integrated Goods and Services Tax (IGST) is ₹ 49,876 crore (including ₹ 26,512 crore collected on imports) and cess is ₹ 7,628 crore (including ₹ 849 crore collected on imports).



The total number of GSTR 3B returns filed for the month of July up to August 31, 2018 is 67 lakh. This is slightly higher than 66 lakh returns of the month of June filed up to July 31, 2018. The last date of filing return of July, 2018 in the state of Kerala was extended up to October 5,

The total revenue earned by Central government and the state governments after settlement including provisional settlement of ₹ 12,000 crore in the month of August, 2018 is ₹ 36,963 crore

for CGST and ₹ 41,136 crore for SGST. For the bi-monthly HE total gross Goods period June-July, 2018, compensation of ₹ 14,930 crore has been released to the states. The revenues collected in August, 2018 of ₹ 93,960 crore is slightly lower than July, 2018 collection of ₹ 96,483 crore, and June, 2018 collection of ₹ 95,610 crore.

One of the main factors for the dip in tax revenues is probable postponement of sale of items for which tax rate was reduced by the Council as the decision to reduce the tax rate was taken in the meeting held on July 21, while the notification of the reduced rate came into effect only from July 27, 2018.

Since it would have taken some time for the market to pass on the benefit of reduced taxes, consumers would have postponed their decision to buy expecting the benefit. The actual impact of reduction of rate of taxes would be observed only from next month onwards as the rate reduction would have got affected only in last few days of the month

Even past trend of indirect tax collection shows that while July collections are 8.2 per cent of the total annual collections, August collections are at a lower level of 7.7 per cent of the total annual collections. This is another reason for lower collections during the month of August as compared to that in July.

IMD begins work to install **AWOS at Kannur Airport**

HE Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has commenced work to install the Automated Weather Observing System (AWOS) at Kannur International Airport, which is expected to begin commercial operation in a month or so, to ensure the safety and efficiency of aircraft operations.

The weather monitoring system is being installed by the IMD, Pune, with the support of the National Aerospace Laboratories (NAL), Bangalore, as per the guidelines of the International Civil Aviation Organization, at a cost of ₹ 3 crore in the fourth international airport of the state.

The facility is being set up at the air traffic control (ATC) tower and on the end of the Runway 25. Besides AWOS, the system has Runway Visual Range – Drishti, an indigenously-developed visibility measuring mechanism designed and fabricated by the NAL.

Religious institutions to get GST refund on food items

AAT News Service

HE 'Seva Bhoj Yojna' is a Central-sector scheme, under which the Central Goods and Services Tax (CGST) and Central government's share of Integrated GST (IGST) paid by charitable religious institutions like temples, gurudwaras, dharmik ashrams, mosques, dargah, church, matth, monasteries etc. on purchase of specific raw food items will be reimbursed to them as financial assistance by the Central government, said Mahesh Sharma, Union Minister of State for Culture.

The specific raw food items covered under the scheme are ghee, edible oil, sugar/burra/jaggery, rice, atta/maida/rava/flour and pulses. These charitable religious institutions should have been distributing free food in the form of prasad/langar/bhandara (community kitchen) to at least 5,000 persons in a calendar month for at least past

for the financial years 2018-19 and 2019-20 is ₹ 150 crore and ₹ 175 crore, respectively.

As per the scheme guidelines, the charitable religious institutions applying for financial assistance under the scheme are required to produce alongwith other relevant documents, a certificate from District Magistrate indicating that the institution is involved in charitable religious activities and is distributing free food to public/devotees etc, since last three years on daily/monthly basis, added the minister.

In addition to this, they are also required to produce chartered accountant's certificate certifying that: the quantity, price and CGST, State GST/Union Territory GST and IGST paid on purchase of specified items during the claim period; the religious institution is involved in religious activities and three years, said Mr Sharma. used only for distributing minister.

The proposed total free food to public/devotees budget outlay of the scheme etc. during the claim period: and the religious institution is using the specified raw food items only for distributing free food to public/devotees etc, during the claim

The scheme guidelines also provides for inspection and monitoring by the officials of the Ministry of Cul-District Collector/Deputy Commissioner and State (GST) Au-

The institutions/organisations are required to maintain separate account for assistance received under the scheme and this account can be inspected/audited by the officers of the ministry or any other agency designated by the ministry.

Further, in case of misuse of funds, the scheme guidelines provide for penalties such as blacklisting the organisations, recovering the assistance provided by ministry with penal interest apart from taking criminal specific items have been action as per law, added the

Since 1933, the Nobel Foundation awarded five more Nobel Prizes to nine scientists for their epoch-making scientific work on fruit fly research. The Foundation awarded the latest, the 2017 Nobel Prize

in Physiology or Medicine to three US scientists, Brandeis University scientists Jeffrey Hall and Michael Rosbash and Rockefeller University biologist Michael Young for their work on circadian rhythms. In 1984, Mr Hall and Mr Rosbash and, independently, Mr Young, found out that a gene period was necessary to maintain circadian rhythms in fruit flies.

Some technology projects including finalisation of specifications and draft standards of hybrid and electric vehicles (xEVs) by Automotive Research Association of India (ARAI), Pune; Development of Charging Infrastructure Management System by Indian Institute of Technology, Madras; Design & development of AC-DC combined public charging stations by ARAI; Development of indigenous chargers (AC/DC/solar) by Aligarh Muslim University are also being supported by the depart-

Recognising the immediate need for reduction in pollution levels and for making cities cleaner and environment friendly, the government is working on Faster Adoption & Manufacturing of Hybrid and Electric Vehicles (FAME)-II scheme having focus on mass & shared public transportation based on electric power train. The necessity for development of charging infrastructure for smooth roll out of electric mobility in the country is being addressed in the phase-II of FAME scheme.

To reduce dependence on fossil fuel and for encouraging cleaner environment, the department has notified FAME India scheme in 2015 under National Electric Mobility Mission Plan of the government. The phase-1 of this scheme is being implemented through four focus areas namely demand creation, pilot projects, charging infrastructure and technology platform and R&D.

Under demand creation component of the scheme, incentive is available to xEVs in the form of an upfront reduced purchase price to enable wider

Beware of cyber warfare, equip police to combat threats: Vice-President

HE era of new age cyber warfare, and the new enemy can be combated only through the power of knowledge, said the Vice-President, M Venkaiah Naidu. He was addressing the 48th Foundation Day of Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D), in New Delhi.

The Vice-President cautioned against cyber attacks by hackers working over the internet thousands of miles away and asked police to be equipped to handle attacks that jeopardise national security. He asked the BPR&D to evolve best practices, policies and procedures in policing to combat emerging new age national security threats.

"Knowledge and competence our police forces and the ability to innovate, improvise and implement will be critical in strengthening national security. We need a Surakshit Bharat as much as a Samruddh Bharat and we cannot have a Surakshit Bharat without a Saksham Bharat," said Mr Naidu.

Indian government has taken various measures to prevent cyber attacks and stressed on the need to augment police response capacities. The set up for combating the new enemy in cyber space can no longer be housed within the walls of a seemingly secure single government agency.

The Vice-President called for

a reorientation of the existing paradigm and said that all security agencies must work in close co-ordination and also with the private sector manning to establish a foolproof ecosystem.

The government and private sector must establish joint mechanisms to protect the police a force against future challenges, including, the threats of modern warfare. All police forces of the country have to equip themselves with cyber forensic techniques and knowledge to counter a cyber attack or investigate a cyber crime, added the Vice-President.

The Union Minister of State for Home Affairs, Kiren Rijiju and other dignitaries were also present on the occasion.

Courses to provide skill development to scientists and technicians have also been drawn up in the Ministry of Science and Technology.

Harsh Vardhan quoted the example of Andhra Pradesh government, which has started the process of providing skill development in the leather industry to about 10,000 persons at a cost of ₹ 30 crore.

It is estimated that at present, there are around 2,00,000 RAC service technicians in the country, with a large number of them being in the informal sector.
