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Realty, IT, mfg sectors to create more jobs in UAE

Managerial-level positions, project management, sales, marketing and finance will be high in demand

THE UAE's real estate, construction, manufacturing, domestic services, market research, media & IT and government sector will create most of the jobs in the coming year, according to industry executives.

The government is trying to make the UAE a hub for manufacturing and corporate services, hence encouraging higher growth for the industries, which will result in creation of more jobs in the country.

The UAE central bank's data revealed that 60,900 additional jobs were created between June 2017 and June 2018, mostly due to construction and real estate activities, surpassing 5-million mark. In total, the UAE added 1.22 per cent additional workers to 5.028 million during the comparative period.

Construction sector added 1.92 per cent workforce to 1.703 million, while real estate firms hired 5.4 per cent additional employees reaching 0.604-million workers. These two sectors are witnessing increased hiring as



public and private sector firms look to complete projects ahead of Expo 2020 Dubai.

However, services and manufacturing sectors reduced the number of jobs by 0.8 per cent to 1.112 million and 4,69,700, respectively, between June 2017 and June this year. The number of jobs in transport, storage and communication declined 3.3 per cent.

Suhail Masri, Vice-President for Employer Solutions, <Bayt.com>, said hiring intentions are on the rise with three in every four UAE employers are planning to hire and the outlook continues to improve as 86 per cent of employers are planning to hire in the coming year.

More than 90 per cent of companies in real estate, construction, domestic services, civil

service, market research and media will be hiring in the coming year. While as many as 64 per cent of advertising, marketing, public relations and aviation sector firms have confirmed hiring in the coming year, he said.

According to Oneal Hector D'Cunha, General Manager for Business Development, Sundus Recruitment and Outsourcing Services, said jobs related to

robotics and Artificial Intelligence from the IT sector will be in high demand.

"There would be increased hiring in IT sector and also in energy sector. As economies are diversifying, we are looking at manufacturing as well. Most of the positions for the junior and mid-level, especially on the engineering side, will see high demand," Mr D'Cunha added.

Ali Matar, Head of LinkedIn for MENA, said recreation and travel sector will be one of the strongest growing industries in terms of recruitment activities in fourth-quarter 2018 and next year.

"Other industries, such as finance, construction and manufacturing, as well as corporate services, continue to play a prevalent role and have experi-

enced significant growth of net hires also. We anticipate this trend to continue through all of next year," he said.

Mr Matar said the government's policies are encouraging job creation as its aims to make the country a hub for industries.

LinkedIn chief sees managerial-level positions as well as project management and sales followed by junior to mid-level roles in marketing and finance will be high in demand.

Mr Masri said majority of the UAE companies will be hiring junior and mid-career positions, with maximum requirement emerging for junior executive, followed by manager, senior executive and coordinator. Still, some companies are looking to fill top management positions, with 35 per cent looking to hire C-Suite or managing director positions.

Sales executive, accountant and project manager emerge among the top roles that UAE respondents are hiring for overall. This is followed by sales manager, director (marketing, project management) and finance analyst.

Big flights from UAE and Saudi to land at Calicut airport

WIDE-BODY flights from the UAE and Saudi Arabia will soon land at Calicut International Airport after the Civil Aviation Authority granted approvals toward the resumption of Boeing 777 and Airbus A330 flights on the airport's runway.

"At any time, airline companies can begin operation of flights after getting the schedule. Saudia has already got approval from the Directorate General of Civil Aviation after meeting the safety assessment and mitigation measures for the operation of wide-bodied aircraft," according to Calicut International Airport Director K Srinivasa Rao.

Calicut Airport is among India's 12 busiest, and Kerala's third-busiest airport. The airport banned wide-body operations in 2015 as a result of a court inquiry into the cause of a 2010 Air India Express Boeing 737 crash in nearby Mangaluru in 2010.

Wide-body operations could resume with Saudia as early as next month. Emirates is reportedly in talks with aviation and airport officials, according to a media report. However, Emirates, in a statement to *Arabian Business*, said it has no immediate plans to operate flights to Calicut.

Bahrain allows subsidiaries of foreign companies

BHRAIN has formally endorsed new rules allowing foreign companies to set up independent subsidiaries which will be able to do business without local partners in Bahrain. The authorities had earlier approved 100 per cent business ownership in certain sectors.

The regulations amend provisions of a corporate law issued in 2001. Establishing independent subsidiaries in the Kingdom will create jobs and help the country diversify away from oil, as the new policy will encourage foreign companies to establish a base there.

The country's Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa, has endorsed the new regulation as part of efforts to boost the national economy.

The move comes two years after Bahrain approved 100 per cent business ownership in certain sectors.

Minister for Industry, Commerce and Tourism Zayed Alzayani presented the regulations at the Cabinet meeting, stressing the importance of the move that could help boost the national economy, according to a report in *Gulf Daily News*.

Bahrain's economy is the smallest among the six-member economic bloc of GCC, a region that accounts for about a third



of the world's proven oil reserves. However, Bahrain, unlike Saudi Arabia, the UAE and Kuwait, lacks foreign exchange buffers and has struggled to maintain growth momentum in the wake of the three-year oil price slump that began in 2014.

Crude prices have strengthened significantly from lows in January 2016, now hovering around \$70 per barrel, however, Bahrain is relying on debt markets to plug the budget deficit and maintain spending to fuel its economy.

At the end of June, Bahrain said Kuwait, Saudi Arabia and the UAE will offer new aid to strengthen the country's "fiscal stability". Finance ministers of the three Arabian Gulf states last month reviewed the fiscal balance programme for Bahrain

and reiterated their support to address Bahrain's financing needs.

"In light of their previous announcement to consider all options to support Bahrain and to finalise an integrated programme to enhance Bahrain's fiscal stability and economic growth, the ministers reaffirmed their countries' commitment to support the financing needs of a fiscal balance programme with targeted indicators," they said in a joint statement at the time, released by Saudi Arabia's Ministry of Information.

It may be recalled that the UAE had earlier approved new rules allowing 100 per cent foreign ownership of companies in the country, something previously limited to those companies based in free zones.

Saudi to pay companies' late fees for visa renewal

THE Saudi government will pay fines levied for the late renewal of workers' residency visas if it is determined the delay was caused by late contract payments by the government, the Saudi Press Agency (SPA) has reported.

"The Cabinet decided that the government shall bear the fine imposed on the employer if it was proved that the delay in renewing the worker's residence permit was due to the government's delay in paying the employer's dues and the worker



was working on the same project," the SPA report said.

The Ministry of Finance has been authorised to carry out the required procurements.

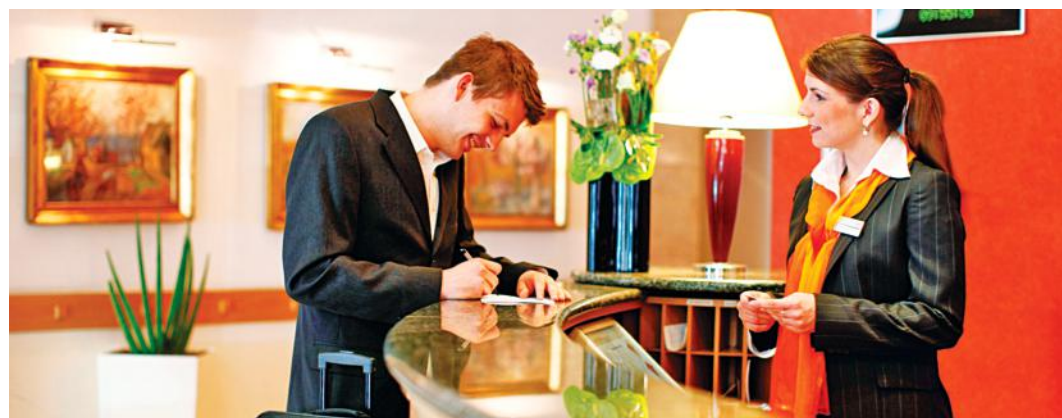
According to media reports,

some contractors in Saudi Arabia - across a wide variety of sectors - are still struggling to receive payment on time, despite assurances from the government that the situation is being rectified.

In January, the ministry launched an electronic platform to allow contractors to check on the status of payments.

Severe delays in government payments were first reported in 2015 and 2016, forcing many companies - including Saudi Binladin and Saudi Oger - to lay off workers after being unable to pay their salaries.

Taj in deal for fourth hotel in Dubai

The hotels are slated for opening in late 2018 and 2019, respectively.





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
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Global Growth

GLOBAL growth is expected to remain steady this year and next at 3.7 per cent, says IMF's latest World Economic Outlook. The growth exceeds that achieved in any of the years between 2012 and 2016, and it occurs as many economies have reached or are nearing full employment and as earlier deflationary fears have dissipated. Thus, policymakers still have an excellent opportunity to build resilience and implement growth-enhancing reforms. Last April, the IMF projected a 3.9 per cent growth rate for both this year and next. Considering developments since then, the number now appears over optimistic. Rather than rising, growth has plateaued at 3.7 per cent. Growth has proven to be less balanced than the IMF had hoped. Growth in the US, buoyed by a pro-cyclical fiscal package, continues at a robust pace and is driving interest rates higher, but US growth will decline once parts of its fiscal stimulus go into reverse. Notwithstanding the present demand momentum in the US, the IMF downgraded its 2019 growth forecast, owing to the recently enacted tariffs on a wide range of imports from China and China's retaliation. China's expected 2019 growth is also marked down. Overall, compared with six months ago, projected 2018-2019 growth in advanced economies is 0.1 percentage point lower, including downgrades for the euro area, the UK and Korea. The negative revisions for emerging market and developing economies are more severe, at minus 0.2 and minus 0.4 percentage point respectively for this year and next year. These revisions are also geographically diverse, encompassing important economies: In Latin America, notably, Argentina, Brazil, and Mexico. In emerging Europe, notably, Turkey. In South Asia, notably, India. In East Asia, notably, Indonesia, Malaysia, also the Philippines. In the Middle East, Iran. And in Africa, South Africa. Although some petroleum exporters, including Nigeria, Kazakhstan, Russia, and Saudi Arabia, are going to benefit from higher prices. Broadly speaking, the IMF see signs of lower investment in manufacturing, coupled with weaker trade growth. With their core inflation rates largely quiescent, advanced economies continue to enjoy easy financial conditions, but this is not true in emerging and developing economies. Even though many emerging economies are managing relatively well there is no denying that the susceptibility to large global shocks has risen. Any sharp reversal for emerging markets would pose a significant threat to advanced economies, as emerging market and developing economies' GDP now constitutes about 40 per cent of world GDP at market exchange rates. Other downside risks that now appear more prominent relate to further disruptions in trade policies. Two major regional trade arrangements are in flux. The US-Mexico-Canada agreement still awaits legislative approval. And the European Union, where the exit terms of Brexit – of Britain, of the UK are being negotiated. US tariffs on China and, more broadly, on auto and auto part imports may disrupt established supply chains, especially if met by retaliation.

THE problem with the orthodox education system is the assembly line production of degree and diploma holders, with no real value. The focus is always on mechanical transfer of facts and information through rote learning. Here, the stress is more on passing an exam and scoring better marks, making the learner into a 'Mark-sist'.

The evaluation and marking pattern being variable and subjective, the outcomes never reveal the real worth and intellect of an individual. Students are made to learn such facts, information and details which often have no correlation with the requirements of a real life.

"So at the end of the day, we have individuals whose minds are cluttered with futile facts and information with no worthwhile life skills, the skills which would see them through their life. The school and university pass outs today have prescribed testimonials, but generally find them at sea to cope up with the challenges of life."

They are found cursing the government or systemic complications for not getting them a job to eke out a living. Hence, all such youths become invalid, looking forward to be supported and spoon-fed through welfare state handouts. It is such woolly-headed youths who often become deviants while looking for shortcuts to success.

After all, if one is looking for a clerk with better linguistic and stenographical skills, what use is it to scout for recognised school or university graduates? Why can't one just look forward to the actual demonstrable skills required for the job, without bothering about a formal degree?

This tendency has given birth to a huge industry and network of certifying agencies and institutions all across the world, both in the private and public sector. The stress on formal education with recognised degrees and diplomas has taken the joy out of education.

Ideally, students should be allowed to pursue education anywhere without the hierarchy and stratification reflected in the variable evaluation outcomes of in-

dividual learners in the mainstream education system.

The extant evaluation scheme elevates or downgrades an individual learner. The system tars everyone with the same brush while evaluating all against the same yardstick. As all learners are different with different inherent talents and faculties, the impartation of knowledge and evaluation of progress ought

to be customised according to individual requirements.

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Scouting for meaningful EDUCATION

"Our education system, if anything, is making a conformist of us all. Being paleoconservative and status-quoist in nature, our education system is programmed to strengthen and reinforce the extant societal values. The learners are expected to be the carriers and pallbearers of fossilised wisdom and knowledge. This in itself is not as bad as is the idea and expectation of passive conformism to the same. The stu-

formist. That is how we see anything and everything around us."

The learners usually accept all that is handed out, without learning to be discriminating and without learning to apply their mind to tell chaff from the grain. The written words in the book and the classroom teaching become the gospel truth for them.

It is such people who later become a liability for the society as they cannot generally differentiate between a 'right' and 'wrong' and easily yield to rabble

rousers' harangues because of which the rightist or extremist forces are on the rise worldwide. Such people don't see any space for 'grey'; they see everything through a binary of 'black' or 'white'.

"Such people are easily swayed by polemical arguments of 'we' versus 'them'. So, if the US or China has 'Nukes', we must have it without bothering to delve into the nuances of the same to dispassionately analyse the issue to see the truth behind. All the problems and troubles in our day-to-day life today stem from a garbled education system.

"While the problems of access and outreach of education are being fixed, we still have huge issues with the quality of the same. The stress on livelihood and job fixation has made the imparting and acquiring of education very perfunctory and monotonous. Often a learner ends up going against her instincts or innate talents because of familial or societal pressure.

"When a potentially good musician becomes an average engineer against his will, the fallout is dangerous. The individual remains alienated throughout his life as he never derives any pleasure from his work."

Performance of a work sans interest, affection and devotion is a sure short recipe for a disaster waiting to happen. Factory accidents or collapse of a structure are results of such alienating education. What is more troubling is the fact that all this has long been understood and discussed with matching government guidelines also having been issued.

"However, we don't have the corresponding executing agency to ensure effective and efficient implementation of the same. We find ourselves at sea while effecting the same because of multiple systemic constraints and complications. That is why, it is high time we started talking about an alternative education system. Our present educational organisation needs to be reoriented to ensure our children are able to realise themselves by fully exploring all the intrinsic talents and faculties.

"The mental capacities of all

healthy humans are the same, it is the availability of right opportunities and resources which make all the differences. Our education system should be so oriented to ensure the correct recognition of innate faculties of each individual to ensure flowering of the same, without any straitjacketing of formal education.

"An individual growing according to one's true talents would not only bloom into a satisfied and successful human being, she shall also be able to contribute to the society to the fullest of her capacity.

"Besides, instead of forcing down one's gullet useless information and facts, we should ensure that our children and youth have all the essential life skills as would be required to see them through their life without any crutches of governmental support.

"Today, most of our youths would find themselves rudderless if taken out of their comfort zone of learnt craft or skill. Our education should be such which should make a complete person of an individual. Equipped with basic life skills, as far as possible and practicable, our youths should always feel confident to survive in any situation or circumstances.

"In the fast-evolving futuristic world of information technology, it has been suggested that most of the jobs shall soon be taken over by machines, robots and artificial intelligence with only certain works requiring manual labour remaining left out. Today, when we shun manual labour finding it infra dig and when we are fast becoming an indoor generation, it's advisable that we learn the value of manual labour to remain healthy and fit, to refashion human life to better appreciate its beauty.

"In times to come, we shall be required to spend more time in intellectual rumination and contemplation to uplift ourselves individually and collectively. To do the same, we would require a speedier reorientation of the extant education system. We shall delay the same only at our own peril."

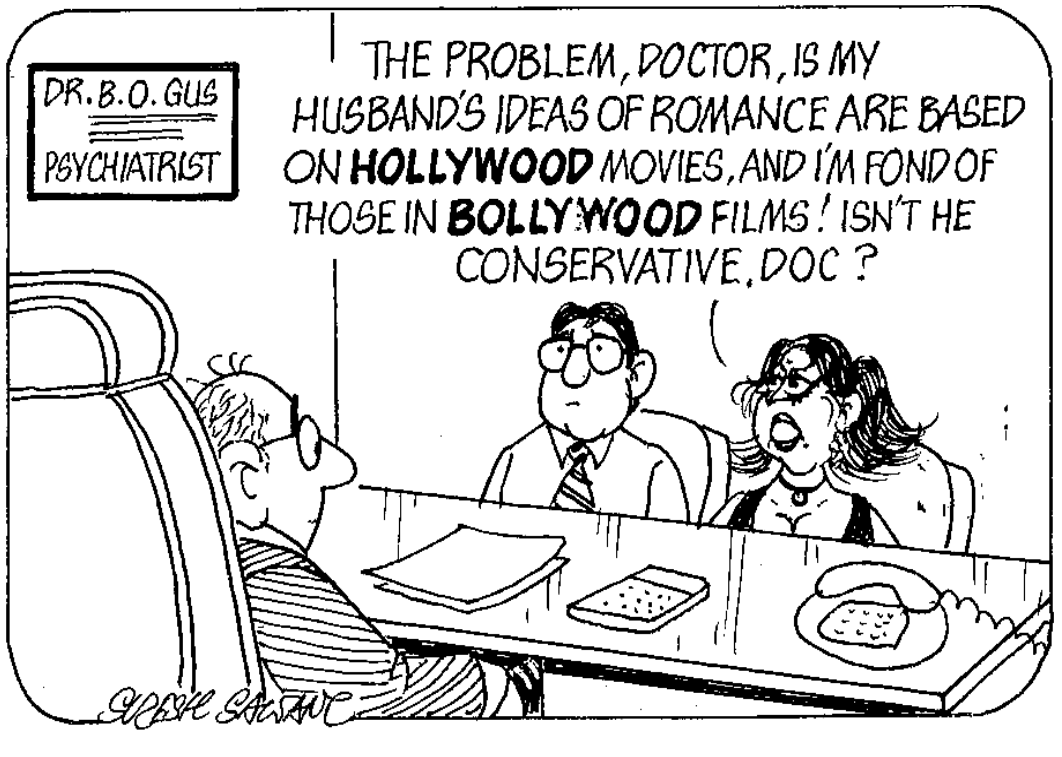

It does not require any special purpose internet service provider or data connectivity. The common feature includes displaying text, images for viewing, video streaming, e-Brochure; for viewing or downloading for offline reference.

Hemant Darbari, Director General, C-DAC said, "CIMS is

very easy to setup and configure for deployments at locations such as Parliament, education institutes (e-Books, timetable, news of the day, notices), railways (train running information, station layout maps), hospitals (doctors on duty, patient records).

A user can connect via any smart device with WiFi capability and freely access the available information. Web pages are retrieved and delivers it across the internet. In the simplest case, the video file is embedded in a webpage and stored on the same host as the other components of the page, said Mr Darbari.

Workers are architects of modern India

WORKERS of the country are architects of modern India, said the Union Minister of State for Labour and Employment, Santosh Kumar Gangwar, while speaking on Vishwakarma Jayanti. He gave away 28 Vishwakarma Rashtriya Puraskar (VRP) shared by 139 individuals and 128 National Safety Awards (NSA) for the performance year 2016 at a special function in New Delhi.

Addressing the function, Mr Gangwar said, there are around six crore organised sector workers who are getting benefits of Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) and Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC). The Prime Minister, Narendra Modi is specially concerned about around 40 crore unorganised sector workers. The Union government has taken many steps to enhance their working conditions, safety and social security in order to improve their standard of living, said Mr Gangwar.

An amount of ₹ 40,000 crore has been collected as cess for welfare of construction workers and this fund is being utilised by state governments for welfare of nearly five crore construction workers. The government is concerned for well being and safety of women workers too.

Recently, creche facility for the organisation with 50 or more workers has been made compulsory. Maternity leave has been extended up to 26 weeks from 12 weeks. The honorarium of 14 lakh anganwadi workers have been increased from ₹ 3,000 per month to ₹ 4,500 per month. Likewise, honorarium of anganwadi helpers has also been increased from ₹ 1,500 to ₹ 2,250 per month, said the minister.

The ministry is making efforts

to increase employment opportunities through Pradhan Mantri Rojgar Protsahan Yojana. About 12 per cent of the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) contribution of new employees is being given by government so that employees may not have to bear this cost and enhancement of employment opportunities. The government has spent ₹ 1,744 crore for EPF contribution of around 72 lakh employees of nearly 87,000 organisations, said the minister.

The Ministry of Labour & Employment has been operating the Vishwakarma Rashtriya Puraskar (previously known as Shram Vir National Awards) and National Safety awards since 1965. VRP is awarded in recognition of outstanding suggestions given by a worker or group of workers and implemented by the management during the previous calendar year resulting improvement in quality, productivity and working conditions such as safety, health and environmental conservation in the industrial undertakings where suggestion schemes are in operation.

28 VRP awards were given in the form of cash prize and a certificate of merit in three categories: Five awards of ₹ 75,000 in class A, eight awards of ₹ 50,000 in class B and 15 awards of ₹ 25,000 in class C categories.

The National Safety Awards (NSA) is given in recognition of outstanding safety performance of industrial establishments, construction sites, ports and installations under Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB) to stimulate and maintain the interests of both the management and the workers in accident prevention programmes. The awards were given under 12 schemes, out of which 10 are meant for factories/construction sites/installations under AERB and two are for ports.

Medical cyclotron facility Cyclone-30 becomes operational in Kolkata

CYCLOTRONS are used to produce radioisotopes for diagnostic and therapeutic use for cancer care. Cyclone-30, the biggest cyclotron in India for medical application became operational recently when 30 MeV beam reached the Faraday Cup for the first time.

Subsequently, beam from this facility was used to produce 18F (Fluorine-18 isotope) for the preparation of [18 F]Fluorodeoxyglucose (FDG), a radio-pharmaceutical used by Board of Radiation & Isotope Technology (BRIT). The facility will start regular production by the middle of the next year after the commissioning of the supporting nuclear systems and regulatory clearances. Cyclone-30 facility at VECC, Kolkata, a Department of Atomic Energy (DAE) unit, will have many unique features,



under various stages of implementation, which are first of its kind in many ways.

After the commissioning of liquid target (for FDG production) and solid targets (production of Germanium-68, Palladium-103 and other isotopes), work on studies related to installation of iodine isotope [1-123] production target, material study target and accelerator driven system target will also be taken up.

This facility will provide for affordable radio isotopes and

related radiopharmaceuticals for the entire country especially, for Eastern India and also have export potential for germanium-68/gallium-68 generator for in-situ production of gallium-68 and palladium-103 isotopes, used for breast cancer diagnosis and prostate cancer treatment, respectively.

Cyclone-30 commissioning re-emphasises the capability of Indian scientists and engineers to deliver at the highest level of science and technology.

Government paves way for amalgamated PSBs

THE Bank of Baroda, Vijaya Bank and Dena Bank may consider amalgamation of the three banks. The envisaged amalgamation will be the first-ever three-way consolidation of banks in India, with a combined business of ₹ 14.82 lakh crore, making it India's third-largest bank.

The consolidation will help create a strong globally competitive bank with economies of scale and enable realisation of wide-ranging synergies. Leveraging of networks, low-cost deposits and subsidiaries of the three banks has the potential of yielding significant synergies for positioning the consolidated entity for substantial rise in customer base, market reach, operational efficiency, wider bouquet of products and services, and improved access for customers.

Some of the strengths of the envisaged amalgamated entity are – Provision Coverage Ratio (PCR) at 67.5 per cent is well above public sector banks (PSBs) average (63.7 per cent), and steadily increasing.

Net non-performing assets (NPA) ratio at 5.71 per cent significantly better than PSB average (12.13 per cent), and declining further.

Gross NPAs for the combined entity have started declining (decline of ₹ 1,048 crore in Q1).

Cost to income ratio of the combined entity at 48.94 per cent better than the PSB average of 53.92 per cent.

Dena Bank's strength in micro, small and medium enterprise (MSME) will further augment the strength of the other two to position the amalgamated bank for being an MSME Udyamimitra

(CRAR) at 12.25 per cent is significantly above the regulatory norm of 10.875 per cent, and stronger amalgamated bank will be better positioned to tap capital markets.

Significant cost benefits from synergies: Larger distribution network will reduce operating and distribution costs with benefits for the amalgamated bank, its customers and their subsidiaries.

Global network strength of Bank of Baroda will be leveraged to enable customers of Dena Bank and Vijaya Bank to have global access.

Home Min launches portals to strengthen women safety

THE Union Minister for Home, Rajnath Singh, launched two separate portals to strengthen women safety. The portal <cybercrime.gov.in> will receive complaints from citizens on objectionable online content related to child pornography, child sexual abuse material, sexually explicit material such as rape and gang rape.

The National Database on Sexual Offenders (NDSO), which is accessible only to law enforcement agencies, will assist in effectively tracking and investigating cases of sexual offences.

Addressing the officers from the states through a video conference, Mr Singh said, the government has taken several measures to check crime against women and children, including provision of stringent punishment and creation of modern forensic facilities to improve investigation, creation of women's safety division in the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) and launching of safe city projects for women's safety.

The two portals launched are part of efforts in the direction of strengthening security of women and children. However, Mr Rajnath said the field level challenges have to be overcome by the police at the ground level to ensure speedy justice to the victims.

He urged them to fully utilise potential of the two portals and update the database regularly for greater effectiveness. The minister appreciated measures introduced by some of the states to check crimes against women and children, and urged them to share best practices for adoption by others.

Speaking on the occasion, the Union Minister for Women

& Child Development, Maneka Sanjay Gandhi, urged the law enforcement agencies to pay special attention to the safety of children at shelter homes. She also underlined the need for provision of forensic kits at police stations for quick investigation of sexual crimes. She also asked the police to take prompt action in cases where a husband abandons wife shortly after marriage.

The Union Home Secretary, Rajiv Gauba, highlighted the need for timebound completion of investigation in sexual crimes to instill deterrence among potential offenders. While appreciating the progress made by Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh police, he said MHA will monitor progress in all

states. The two portals will be extremely helpful to the law enforcement agencies especially in investigation where offenders migrate to other states after committing the crime.

The Cyber Crime Prevention Against Women and Children (CCPWC) portal is convenient and user friendly that will enable complainants in reporting cases without disclosing their identity. This will not only aid the victims/complainants but also help the civil society organisations and responsible citizens to anonymously report complaints pertaining to child pornography, child sexual abuse material or sexually explicit material such as rape and gang rape.

Complainants can also upload the objectionable content

and URL to assist in the investigation by the state police. The complaints registered through the portal will be handled by police authorities of respective state/Union territories (UTs). There are other features such as a victim or complainant can track his/her report by opting for 'report and track' option using his/her mobile number.

The National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) will proactively identify such objectionable content and take up with intermediaries for its removal. For this, NCRB has already been notified as the Government of India agency to issue notices under Section 79(3)b of IT Act.

The second portal unveiled by the Home Minister relates to NDSO. It is a central database of "sexual offenders" in the country which will be maintained by NCRB for regular monitoring and tracking by state police.

The database is accessible only to the law enforcement agencies for investigation and monitoring purpose. The database will include offenders convicted under charges of rape, gang rape, Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) and eve-teasing.

At present the database contains 4.4 lakh entries. The state police have been requested to regularly update the database from 2005 onwards. The database includes name, address, photograph and fingerprint details for each entry. However, the database will not compromise any individual's privacy.

Ministry of Home Affairs has already released a grant of ₹ 94.5 crore to states/UTs for establishing cyber forensic-cum-training laboratories to strengthen cybercrime investigation and conduct training programmes to enhance capabilities of police officers, public prosecutors and judicial officers.

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NOWADAYS, burning of straw, may be of rice or wheat, in agricultural fields emits a large amount of pollutants including toxic gases like carbon monoxide, volatile organic compound, and carcinogenic polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons and fine/inhalable particles.

These are very dangerous to human beings and other fauna & flora too. The burning of straw contributes significantly to emission of greenhouse gases like carbon dioxide, ammonia, methane and other pollutants, consequently causing the global warming.

Intensive burning of agricultural waste substantially contributes to the formation of the atmospheric brown cloud and that affects the local air quality, atmospheric visibility and the earth climate.

In India, about 141.2-million tonnes straw is in use and from that about 7-lakh tonnes nitrogen, 8.4-lakh tonnes phosphorus and 21-lakh tonnes potassium is supplied. About 25 per cent of nitrogen, 25 per cent phosphorus, 50 per cent sulphur and 75 per cent potassium uptake by cereal crops are retained in residues, making the valuable sources of nutrients.

If considering 50 per cent crop residue utilised as animal feed, the rest can be recycled. The various applications of residues other than animal feed are as in composting, thatching for rural homes and fuel for domestic and industrial use.

But, the current practice of burning crop residues in fields is one of the most significant activities of global biomass burning biofuels and contributes substantially to air pollution. After harvesting, the waste straw is frequently burned in the open regions with insufficient time

before planting the next crop.

Most of the stubble burning takes place over three weeks in October-November, releasing particulates and smog-forming carbon monoxide and nitrogen

such as nitrogen, potassium, phosphorous and sulphur due to the burning.

However, in contrast to closed burning, the open burning of straw is an uncontrolled com-

Complete burning of the rice and wheat straw resulted in 100, 20.1, 19.8 and 80.2 per cent

loss of nutrients.

There is a need to validate the emission estimates experimentally and the associated uncertainty in the estimates. The residues can be put to various productive usage such as incorporation in the fields, bioenergy etc. This is possible only if residues are collected and managed properly.

Rice straw burning has been linked to increased asthma attack in the children and even in adult. Due to smoke and shoot suspended in the air, many disease like cough, cold, TB, cancer, irritation in eyes, allergy, choking of lungs and problem in breathing and other respiratory problem

Residue retention significantly increases the amount of mineralisable carbon and nitrogen in the soil as compared to situation where the residue is repeatedly burnt.

This also increases the activity of rapid decomposition and ensures turnover of organic matter, resulting in greater amount of available nutrient over times, conserving moisture and improve soil health, and control atmos-

oxide, which drift from the fields over almost the entire Indo-Gangetic plain.

This pollution contributes around 12-60 per cent of particulate concentrations depending on the generation of other pollutants in different locations, winds, temperature and other local factors. Farmers themselves are doubly harmed, by the local air pollution caused, and by the loss of soil nutrients

bustion process in which the products of burning are emitted into the atmosphere, such as carbon dioxide, carbon monoxide, methane, promethium, nitrogen oxide, and sulphur dioxide influencing both the local air quality and global climate.

Punjab and Haryana alone contribute 48 per cent of this total and is subject to open-field burning and that thought to have contributed about 20 per cent

and 100, 22.2, 21.8 and 75 per cent losses of nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium and sulphur, respectively. The burning of straw (crop residue) is not desirable.

But large-scale burning of crop straw of rice and wheat system in Punjab, Haryana and western Uttar Pradesh has become a matter of serious concern not only for greenhouse gas emission, but also for problems of pollution, health hazards and

about the negative impact of crop biomass burning and importance of crop residues incorporation in soil for maintaining sustainable agricultural productivity.

The waste types that can be disposed of by burning without an environmental permit are restricted to vegetation; untreated wood & timber; logs & branches from fallen or chopped-down trees; untreated timber from fence mending; hedge trimmings; crops & vegetation and leaves & bark.

The crop residue management can have a significant impact on carbon and nitrogen levels and the carbon/nitrogen ratio, which directly affects top soil layer due to the straw burning.

pheric pollution.

There are some advantages of burning straw like it quickly clears the field and is cheap method for next sowing. It kills weeds, including those resistant to herbicide, kill slugs and other pests and reduces nitrogen tie-up.

Some harmful effects are loss of nutrients, bad impact on soil microbes and fauna, increase in erosion (wind and water), loss of carbon, reduction in soil structure (soil aggregate stability) and increase in acidity over the time.

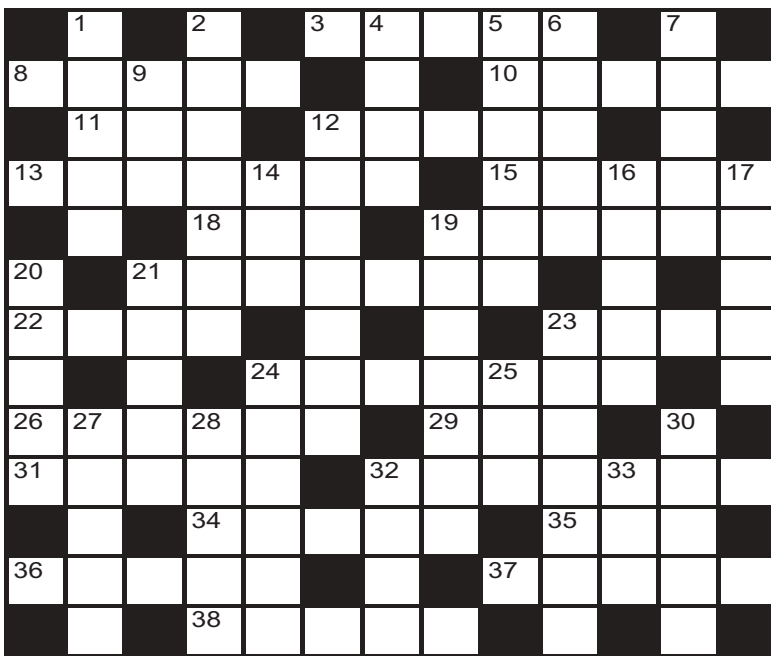
